

**SHAC Minutes**  
**December 11, 2008**

The Chair, Sheryl Hime, called the meeting to order at 4:05pm.

Ronnie Peacock, CISD Athletic Director, provided information on Texas Senate Bill 82. The Bill is related to safety regulations for certain public school extracurricular activities including safety training for all coaches, sponsors or athletic trainers for athletic activities, and any marching band director. It is effective for the 2008-2009 school year.

Mr. Peacock also provided an update on State mandated steroid testing for high school athletics. He shared that two CISD campuses had been tested so for this school year.

Sheryl Hime presented information about training all CISD health teachers received on the changes made to the CISD Health Curriculum. The new CISD Health Curriculum incorporates the Parenting and Paternity Awareness (p.a.p.a.) program from the State's Attorney General's Office. The training was provided on October 29th, 2008.

Dr. Chris Hines, CISD Associate Superintendent, provided an update on the Texas Fitness Grant. Washington Junior High and Travis Intermediate received the grant again for the 2008-2009 school year.

Sherry Sunderman, CISD Director of Guidance and Counseling, provided information about the formation of an Advanced Crisis Response Team to meet CISD needs in the event of several crisis situations occurring at one time. The Team has representatives from all high school feeder systems.

Linda Matthews, CISD Parent Education Program Specialist, provided the following statistics about the Parenting Education Program: CISD has over 50 pregnant students so far this school year and currently has 91 students in the parenting program. CISD has provided childcare for over 30 students during the 2008-2009 school year. A new mentoring program has been started for the girls in the program with the First Presbyterian Church.

Dr. Hines provided information about an online program explaining cyberbullying and student use of technology.
