In 2013, Dr. Dale Okorodudu founded Black Men in White Coats (BMWC) in response to a report highlighting the decreasing number of black male applicants to medical school. Dr. Dale recognized the need to encourage students – both boys and girls – from diverse backgrounds to pursue higher education and careers in medicine and he took action.

BMWC Youth Summits bring students and healthcare professionals together, increasing exposure to careers in the medical field and allowing participants to establish a professional network. Local summits are independently organized to educate students, parents, teachers, and community leaders on what it takes to become a healthcare professional.
