For over a decade, Conroe ISD grew by an average of 1,500 students per year.



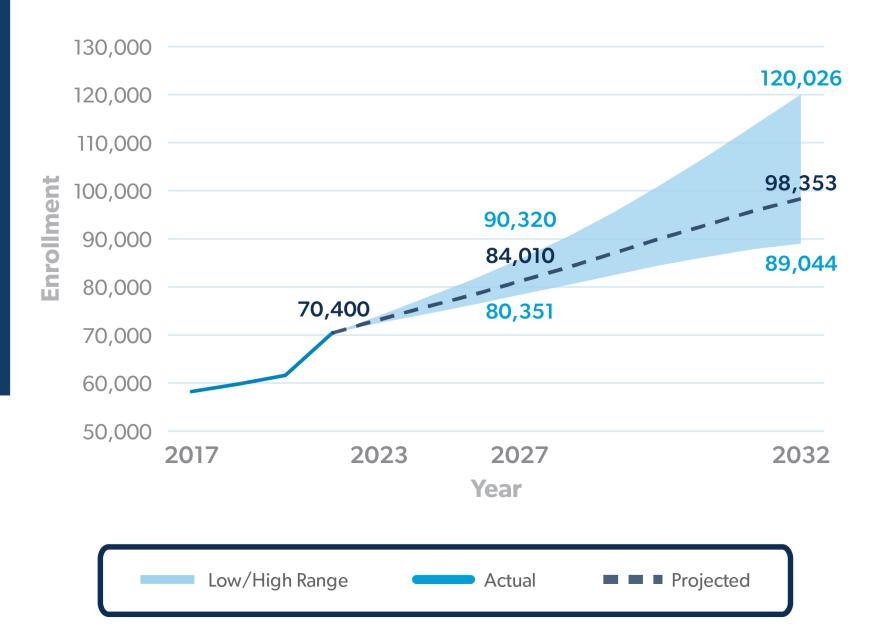

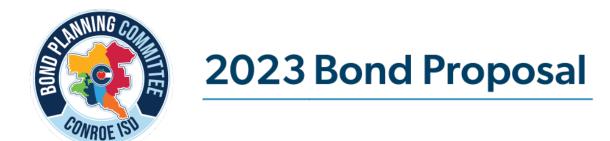
