Dates and Times of Session

(Students will take both sessions)

Session 1

April 23 – June 6, Mondays and Wednesdays

6 pm – 8 pm at McCullough Jr. High School

Student Holiday: May 28, 2018

- Parents are expected to attend first class on April 23 with their student
- Transportation is not provided during Session 1

Session 2

June 11 – July 13, Tuesdays and Thursdays

8 am – 3 pm at McCullough Jr. High School

Student Holiday: July 4, 2018

- Additional time may be required based on the grade average

Mondays, Wednesdays, and Fridays – Students must log in and complete assignments.

- Daily log-in is required to receive credit.

Tuition

\$410 per course for district students

\$560 per course for out-of-district students

Course Offerings

- **7th Grade Math** for 6th graders going into 7th grade transitioning to PreAlgebra
- **8th Grade PreAlgebra** for 6th grade Advanced Math or 7th grade level math students that are interested in transitioning to Algebra I
- **Algebra I** for 8th graders going into 9th grade
- **Geometry PreAP** for 8th graders going into 9th grade who have successfully completed Algebra I and have principal approval to take Geometry PreAP during

In order to be approved for these courses, students must have a minimum grade average of 80, and are recommended to have scored at final Level II on the previous year's STAAR final exam in mathematics.

Students who meet the course criteria should register for these courses with their counselor.

Registration will be open April 2 – 16, 2018.

There will be mandatory parent orientation on Tuesday, April 17, 2018, at 6:30 pm at McCullough Junior High School or Thursday, April 19, 2018, at 6:30 pm at Irons Junior High School. Students enrolled in Algebra I are expected to take the end-of-course exams during the testing window of July 9-13, 2018.

Test Date: TBD.

Blended/Virtual Learning Student Expectations

It is important that students and parents understand the expectations for taking an accelerated course through the blended/virtual learning model. Each student interested in taking a course needs to read the expectations listed below prior to registering for the course.

1. Students must have access to and fluency with a computer and the CISD Outlook email system.
2. It is the responsibility of the student/parent to maintain their computer and/or software. If the student does not have access at home to a computer and/or to the Internet, the student needs to make his/her counselor aware when registering for the course. CISD will provide assistance.
3. Students are expected to commit to full participation in the virtual course including regular attendance and completion of assigned coursework.
4. Students are responsible for completing and submitting all assignments by the established due date.

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5. All work performed and submitted will be the student's own work. Students providing lesson assignments, tests, and exams determined not to be their own work will be subject to disciplinary actions as detailed in the CISD Secondary Student Handbook.
6. Time spent on coursework will be monitored. Students are expected to spend time every day on their virtual course in order to keep up with assignments in addition to fulfilling their regular classroom responsibilities.
7. Students agree to check their First Class email account on a regular basis during the week and weekends for communications regarding their virtual course.
8. Inappropriate online communications or inappropriate use of online tools may lead to disciplinary action.
9. Students enrolled in virtual courses are subject to the CISD discipline policies and procedures as detailed in the CISD Secondary Student Handbook.
10. Students enrolled in Algebra I will be required to take the end-of-course (EOC) exam in December 2018.
11. Students are expected to maintain a minimum grade of 80 to remain in the course.

Registration and Payment

Students will preregister for summer online accelerated initial credit from April 2– 16, 2018.

Procedures for Registration at each Campus:

Step 1: See the counselor for guidance in course selection. The counselor will create a registration form for the student. 6th grade students will register at their junior high campus.

Step 2: Pay online at www.mathaccelss.com with either a credit card or debit card. (The student/parent will be given a flyer with directions for accessing the website and procedures to follow. The payment can be made from home or the campus will have a computer available for parents to access at the time of preregistration.)

Step 3: Forward email confirmation or take a printed copy of email to counselor for class enrollment.

Payment Options:

- Credit Card or Debit Card

Refunds: Refunds will be by check and can be processed once a refund request form has been completed and approved. A \$20 processing fee will apply. (Processing fee will be waived for canceled classes.)

Financial Aid: Financial aid is available for in-district students based on qualification for the Federal lunch program. Students and parents should discuss this with the counselor or building principal. They will communicate the need for financial aid with the summer school principal.

Course credit will not be awarded if payment has not been received in full.

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Summer School Rules and Guidelines

Campus and CISD Code of Conduct rules will apply. Students will be given specific rules on the first day of class. A closed campus will be observed during summer school.

A minimum of 15 students must enroll in a course in order for the course to be held.

Attendance: Regular attendance is of great importance. Students will be held responsible for all work missed due to an absence without any undue amount of work on the part of the instructor.

- **Only ½ day of absence per session is allowed in summer school regardless of the number of sessions/courses taken.**
- Students leaving school 15 minutes or more before school is dismissed will receive an equivalent of a tardy. Four tardies result in one absence.
- **Tardies:** A tardy is from 0-15 minutes late to class. Four tardies will result in one absence. A ½ day absence results if a student is more than 15 minutes late to class or school. A full-day absence will be recorded for any student failing to attend class after any break.
- Semester exams are administered the last day of each session. There are no test exemptions in summer school. **Students must be present the last day of each session in order to receive credit in the course.**

If a student withdraws after the second day of summer school, tuition will not be refunded. If students are dropped for disciplinary reasons, they will forfeit their tuition.

Students who choose to eat at school will need to bring a lunch. Limited snacks and drinks will be available for sale by booster organizations in the cafeteria area during break time.

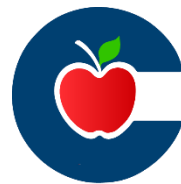
