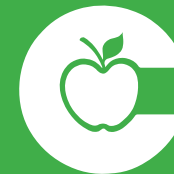

Bilingual Teacher Scholarship

 The **Bilingual Teacher Scholarship** is available to Conroe ISD bilingual, instructional paraprofessionals who desire to pursue an elementary education degree, with a bilingual EC-6 teaching certification. Selected recipients are awarded a maximum of \$500 a semester for six registered hours at an accredited university, pending available grant funds.

Requirements:

- Maintain six credit hours each semester;
- Earn a minimum 2.5 GPA each semester (*fall, spring, summer*);
- Enroll each semester until graduation;
- Submit to the Conroe ISD HR Department each semester official transcripts with grades reported, registration schedule, and tuition receipts;
- Obtain a bilingual EC-6 Core Subjects Texas teacher certificate; and
- Commit to three years of employment with Conroe ISD upon graduation.


Bilingual Teacher Scholarship

 The **Bilingual Administrator Scholarship** is available to Conroe ISD teachers who are certified in bilingual (Spanish) education or secondary Spanish and who desire to pursue a master's degree in educational leadership and certification as a principal. Selected recipients are awarded a maximum of \$500 a semester, pending available grant funds, for six registered hours at an accredited university toward a master's degree and a principal certification.

Requirements:

- Maintain six credit hours each semester;
- Earn a minimum 3.5 GPA each semester (*fall, spring, summer*);
- Served in a leadership capacity (*i.e., District-wide committees, team leader, department chair, etc.*);
- Speak, read, and write Spanish fluently;
- Submit to the Conroe ISD HR Department each semester official transcripts with grades reported, registration schedule, and tuition receipts;
- Obtain a Texas principal certification; and
- Commit to three years of employment with Conroe ISD upon graduation.

Diagnostician/Speech Language Pathologist (SLP) Scholarship

 The **Diagnostician/SLP Scholarship** is available to Conroe ISD teachers/assistant SLPs who have taught full time/worked full time as an assistant SLP in the District for at least one school year and who desire to pursue certification as a diagnostician or an SLP. Selected recipients are awarded a maximum of \$500 a semester, pending available grant funds, for six registered hours at an accredited university toward a master's degree and an educational diagnostician certificate or Texas Speech Language Pathology license.

Requirements:

- Maintain six credit hours each semester;
- Earn a minimum 3.5 GPA each semester (*fall, spring, summer*);
- Submit to the Conroe ISD HR Department each semester official transcripts with grades reported, registration schedule, and tuition receipts;
- Obtain a Texas educational diagnostician certification or Texas Speech Language Pathology license; and
- Commit to three years of employment with Conroe ISD upon graduation.

Application Process

- Complete and submit the appropriate scholarship application (*available online*) to the Conroe ISD HR Department, along with an updated résumé;
- Write and submit an essay for review, as outlined in the specific scholarship application;
- Obtain two recommendation forms (*available online*) to be completed and submitted by professional supervisors; and
- For some scholarships, an interview with Human Resources may be necessary.
