



**Federal Grant Entitlements
Preliminary Planning Amounts and Proposed Uses
Conroe ISD**

Program, Program Intent and Allocation
<p>Title I, Part A: \$8,570,387 Program Intent: Economically Disadvantaged Education Funds to help schools with high concentrations of students from low-income families provide a high-quality education enabling all children to exceed the state's student performance standards. Proposed Uses: Instructional materials to address academic needs in classrooms, teacher training in best practices, additional teachers and paraprofessionals to assist students, Instructional coaches to build capacity of teachers, tutorials for students, and family engagement activities.</p>
<p>Title I, Part C: \$45,591 Program Intent: Migrant Education Funds support programs, which help migrant students overcome the challenges of a migratory lifestyle enabling migrant students to succeed in school. Proposed Uses: Paraprofessional to assist migrant students, instructional materials, technology devices and support, and additional learning opportunities for students.</p>
<p>Title I, Part D: \$146,025 Program Intent: Delinquent Education Funds to carry out high quality education programs for students who are in a delinquent setting or transitioning from disciplinary placements back to home campuses. Proposed Uses: Instructional materials to address academic needs of students to close learning gaps, teacher training in best practices, additional paraprofessional to assist students, and strategies to address social and emotional needs of students.</p>
<p>Title II: \$1,606,138 Program Intent: Teacher and Principal Training and Recruiting Funds are designated to supplement staff training in district and campus priority areas, enhance recruiting, hiring, and retention of highly qualified teachers, and improve the quality of our principal, teacher, and paraprofessional work force. Proposed Uses: Increase student achievement, improve educator quality and effectiveness, increase the number of effective educators, and provide low-income and minority students greater access to effective educators.</p>
<p>Title III: \$1,078,010 Program Intent: English Language Acquisition, Language Enhancement, and Academic Achievement Education Funds ensure that English Learner students develop English proficiency and meet the same academic achievement standards other students achieve. Proposed Uses: Instructional Materials to address academic needs in classrooms, Teacher training in best practices, Additional teachers and paraprofessionals to assist students, Instructional coaches to build capacity of teachers, Tutorials for students.</p>

Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security (CARES) Act

Elementary and Secondary School Emergency Relief Fund (ESSER I): \$6,515,711

Program Intent: Stimulus Funding provide additional resources to pay for the direct costs incurred for planning and mitigation of the coronavirus pandemic such as additional technology and support, cleaning of buildings, and services needed to maintain educational services for students. Supplanting salaries due to the change in state funding is an allowable expenditure. Planning and implementing activities related to summer learning and supplemental afterschool programs. ESSER I funds will expire in September 2022.

Proposed Uses: As a response to the change in the formula for funding available to Conroe ISD from the Texas Education Agency, Conroe ISD will supplant salaries so that the district could continue educational services to students during the pandemic. Supplies to sanitize and clean facilities, educational technology supplies (hardware, software, and connectivity), and support for the school district. ESSER I funds will be available until September 2022.

Coronavirus Response and Relief Supplemental Appropriations (CRRSA)

Elementary and Secondary School Emergency Relief Fund (ESSER II): \$28,811,173

Program Intent: Emergency Relief Funding provides additional resources to help school districts safely reopen schools, measure and effectively address significant learning loss, and take other actions to mitigate the impact of COVID-19 on the students and families who depend on our K-12 schools.

Proposed Uses: Conroe ISD is seeking guidance from the Texas Education Agency regarding the changes in formula funding for school districts. Funding will sustain services to students. ESSER II funds will be available until September 2023.

American Rescue Plan (ARP)

Elementary and Secondary School Emergency Relief Fund (ESSER III): \$64,705,802

Program Intent: Emergency Funding to help safely reopen and sustain the safe operation of schools and address the impact of the coronavirus pandemic on students. School districts are required to set aside at least 20% of the funds to address student learning loss. Planning and implementing activities related to summer learning and supplemental afterschool programs, including providing classroom instruction or online learning during the summer months and addressing the needs of low-income students, students with disabilities, English learners, migrant students, students experiencing homelessness, and children in foster care.

Proposed Uses: Additional campus staff to maintain educational services to students, district learning recovery and instructional materials, software, and equipment to address unique needs of students. ESSER III funds will be available until September 2024.
