• Could we change the name of artificial turf to "field conversion" or "all-weather surface?"

That is a consideration. Is "turf" a trigger word we need to change?

• If there are more than 400 kids in swimming using the Natatorium, how many are involved in baseball and softball?

More than 500

• How many times have we kicked the gyms and turf down the road, could we go all in with the whole package?

Legally we can't, because athletics is required to be a stand-along prop. We got as close as we could to all-in in 2019 and failed.

• What is the tax rate increase difference as we add more props?

There would be a 1.75 cent tax rate increase for Prop A, while adding the rest raise it to 2.0-2.25.
