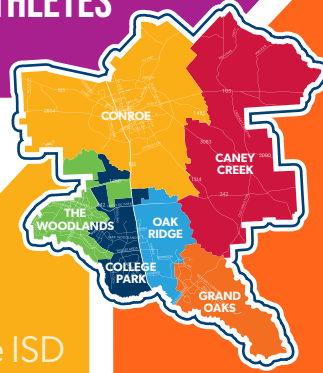

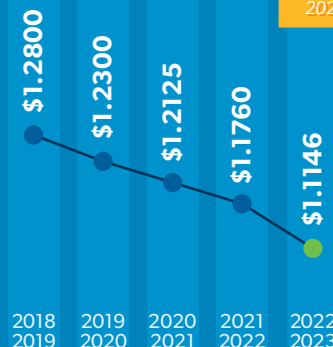

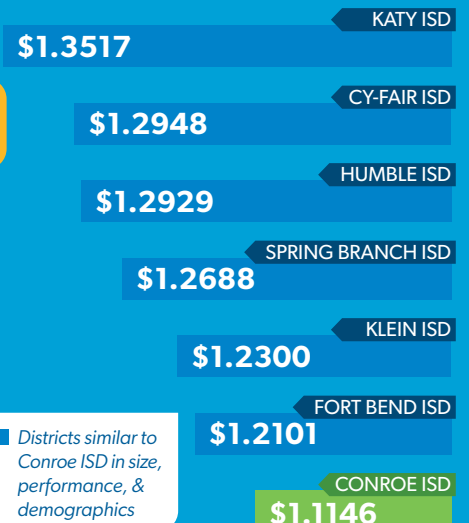
TAX RATE HISTORY

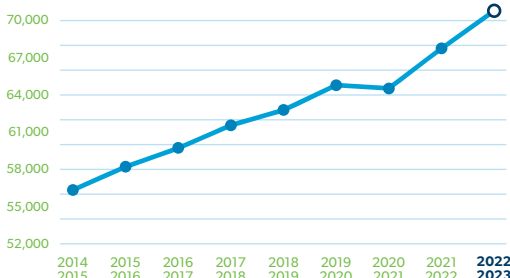


TAX RATE COMPARISON

Enrollment Growth

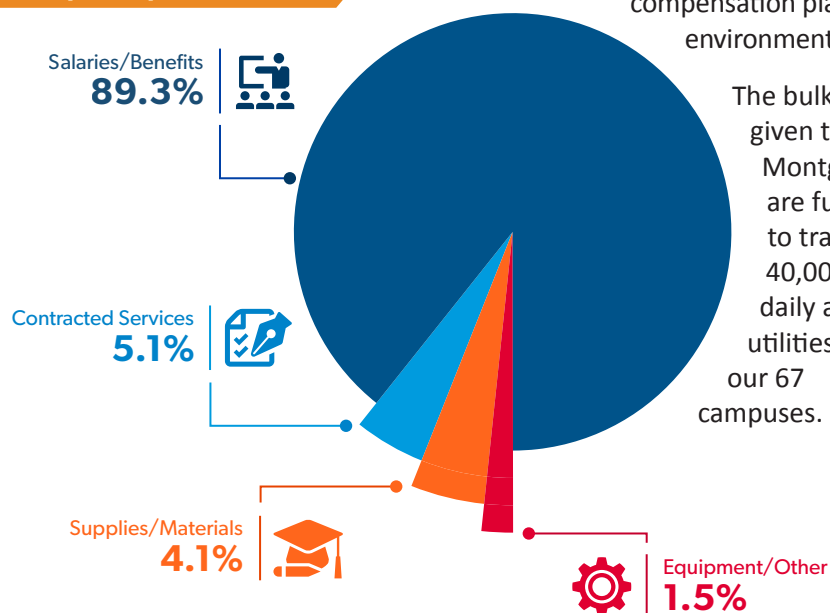

A Look at Conroe ISD's Operating Budget

The approved 2022-2023 Conroe ISD budget included a competitive compensation plan and continued support for maintaining a safe environment for students and staff.



The bulk of Conroe ISD's operating budget is salaries, given that the District is the largest employer in Montgomery County. The next biggest expenditures are fuel for our buses to transport nearly 40,000 students daily and utilities for our 67 campuses.

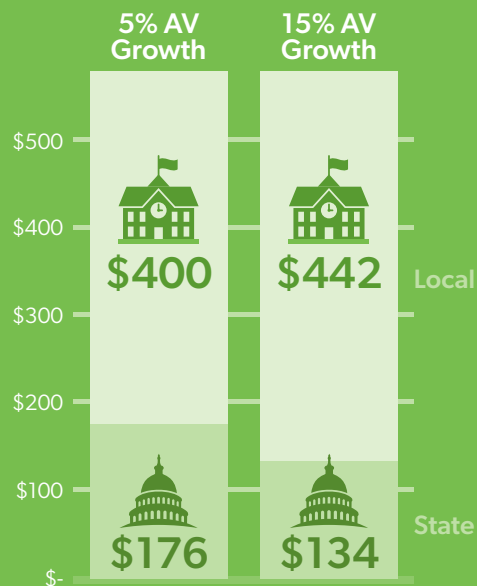
VS. **STATE SHARE LOCAL SHARE**

Although local appraised values (AV) may increase, Conroe ISD does not receive an increase in funding to the maintenance & operations side of the budget because the State reduces the funding it provides to the District, dollar for dollar.
